Summary: This is a ten-month salaried position for a peace studies scholar with a commitment to engaged pedagogy and reflective practice. The fellowship recipient will be a member of the AMBS teaching faculty for the 2022-2023 academic year with teaching and administrative responsibilities commensurate to negotiated FTE.

Primary responsibilities and duties

- Teach courses in peace studies appropriate to areas of expertise and FTE allotment
- Collaborate with AMBS faculty and the Peace Studies Advisory Group to support MATPS (Masters of Arts in Theology and Peace Studies) students in their program requirements
- Fulfill various teaching faculty responsibilities, including academic advising

Qualifications and skills

- Ability to appropriately navigate cultural differences and other diversity
- Commitment to undoing racism and/or similar initiatives
- Personal commitment to Christian faith and discipleship, to Anabaptist-Mennonite values and to the church as a witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ
- A theological vision that includes peacemaking, justice, healing and reconciliation as central to God's reconciling mission
- Scholarly record applicable to the role
- PhD or ABD, or MA/MDiv with equivalent experience, in peace studies or related field
- Post-secondary teaching experience preferred
